6. David's older brother Eliab says to David, "I know your presumption and the evil of your heart, for you have come down to see the battle." God sees David differently. See 1 Samuel 13:14 and 16:7. How does God see David?

7. When we see others living different, our initial reaction may be to give them advice and tell them what to do. God has gifted each of us in a unique way. Trust in the Lord, and trust in the talents he has given you. Use them to serve him.
