## Digging Deeper

### 5. Belgic Confession Article 15: The Doctrine of Original Sin

We believe that by the disobedience of Adam original sin has been spread through the whole human race.<sup>30</sup> It is a corruption of the whole human nature—an inherited depravity which even infects small infants in their mother's womb, and the root which produces in humanity every sort of sin. It is therefore so vile and enormous in God's sight that it is enough to condemn the human race, and it is not abolished or wholly uprooted even by baptism, seeing that sin constantly boils forth as though from a contaminated spring. Nevertheless, it is not imputed to God's children for their condemnation but is forgiven by his grace and mercy—not to put them to sleep but so that the awareness of this corruption might often make believers groan as they long to be set free from the "body of this death."<sup>31</sup> Therefore we reject the error of the Pelagians who say that this sin is nothing else than a matter of imitation.

6. Read 1 Cor. 15:20-28. This passage also speaks of death in Adam and life in Christ. What is it teaching?
7. When Adam and Eve sin God lays out their punishment (Genesis 3:14-19). What is it?
8. In Romans 5:17 we read that believers will reign in life through Jesus Christ. In 1 Cor. 6:2 Paul makes another statement about the reign of the righteous. What does it mean?

## Application

9. We often think of salvation as God fixing our brokenness, but that is an incomplete picture. In Jesus Christ we are given new life. Our sin is not merely forgiven, it is taken from us and we stand before God justified through the blood of Jesus Christ. God has done a good work in you through Jesus Christ giving you new life, do not minimize this free gift.

**Ephesians 1:16** I do not cease to give thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers, **17**that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and of revelation in the knowledge of him, **18**having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, **19**and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might **20**that he worked in Christ when he raised him from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly places, **21**far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come.
