Digging Deeper

5. Heidelberg Catechism Q&A 32:

Q. But why are you called a Christian?

A. Because by faith I am a member of Christ¹ and so I share in his anointing.² I am anointed to confess his name,³ to present myself to him as a living sacrifice of thanks,⁴ to strive with a free conscience against sin and the devil in this life,⁵ and afterward to reign with Christ over all creation for eternity.⁶

- 8. We read a bit of what the Holy Spirit does for us in Romans 8; Jesus tells us more of the benefits of the Holy Spirit in John 14:15-31. Why is the Holy Spirit given to us?

9. At times we may feel alone in our affliction and suffering. We may wonder where God is at or if we are the only ones who have ever gone through these tough times. God is absolutely with us and promises us that one day we will receive our full inheritance: eternal life in Jesus Christ. Until that day, know that you have the Holy Spirit with you, God is with you. Your salvation is a gift from God that cannot be taken away. Trust in the Lord and rest assured.
